

Stockbridge Lions Club Scholarship

The Stockbridge Lions Club Memorial Scholarship provides financial assistance to graduating Stockbridge High School seniors who seek education or training after high school graduation. To qualify, applicants must graduate with a minimum 2.0 GPA and perform at least 15 hours of community service during their senior year.

The community service requirement is in keeping with the Stockbridge Lions commitment to community service. Examples of service organizations that would welcome the involvement of SHS seniors include the Stockbridge Lions, The Masons, Stockbridge Community Outreach, Kids Club, Stockbridge Community Education, local faith-based organizations, SAESA, Habitat for Humanity, senior citizen care homes, and others.

Community service is considered an act of altruism, kindness, or humanitarianism that benefits community members rather than a family member. Participation in school or community performance or extra-curricular activities (athletics, band, choir, drama club, etc.) is not considered community service.

We cannot accept parental signatures in lieu of the supervisor's validation. A note or email from the supervisor documenting the applicant's service will suffice should they not be available to sign the record form.
