We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2022-23 educational progress for Emma Smith Elementary . The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2021-22 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2018-19. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2017-18. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2016-17. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was identified as "No Label Given".

The Smith Elementary School staff continue to revise our School Improvement Plan to include student achievement goals for reading, math, writing, science and social studies based on state and local data. These improvement goals are monitored using testing data evaluated by Northwest Education Association (NWEA) RIT scores and FASTBridge norm-referenced testing programs three times a year. We are currently using testing data as part of our multi-tiered system of supports for academics. We have also significantly increased the amount of Title I support and interventions for all students throughout the building.

Smith Elementary will continue to focus on student achievement in the areas of Reading and Math by using a Multi-Tiered System of Supports for all students at all grade levels. Smith Elementary continues to be a 1:1 school with each teacher having their own set of 30 Chromebooks for their classroom. This allows teachers to have the opportunity to increase technology integration to support and supplement the core curriculum. Teachers continue to improve in this area through Professional Development and peer-to-peer learning groups. Our Reading curriculum (Wonders), Math curriculum (GoMath), and Science curriculum (Mystery Science) all have online components that teachers have been implementing within their classroom daily instruction.

For the 2022/2023 school year, Smith Elementary staff will be implementing the Positivity Project school wide. The Positivity Project is the intentional teaching of the 24 character strengths that are rooted in the research of Positive Psychology. Teaching staff intentionally teach one character strength per week using multiple methods of engaging activities. All staff will be provided with professional development within this program throughout the school year.

Smith Elementary is a Preschool through second grade building within Stockbridge Community Schools. In addition to preschool and Kindergarten, Smith Elementary also has one Young 5 classroom. All students that attend Stockbridge Community Schools that fulfill the Young 5 through second grade age and academic requirements are assigned to Smith Elementary.

Smith Elementary School in Stockbridge Community Schools' is a Young 5/Kindergarten through second grade facility. Smith also houses a GSRP and tuition based preschool programs.
