1. What was the total amount of the district's Section 31a allocation for the 2025-26 school year?

2. Describe the district's methodology and decision-making for distributing Section 31a At-risk grant funds to target the buildings with the highest needs.

The district uses a data driven process to distribute Section 31a At Risk funds based on student need. Funding is prioritized for buildings with the highest concentrations of at risk students using factors such as economic disadvantage, academic performance, attendance, and other student data outcome. District and building leaders review this information annually to determine funding allocations and ensure resources are directed to the schools with the greatest needs and aligned with Section 31a requirements.

3. What evidence-based interventions and services were implemented with the Section 31a At-risk grant funds during the 2025-26 grant cycle?

During the 2025-2026 school year, Section 31a At-Risk funds supported evidence-based interventions and services, including targeted reading and math intervention, academic tutoring, credit recovery, attendance support, social-emotional learning, behavior intervention services, and mental health supports. Funds also supported staff and programs designed to improve student achievement, engagement, and overall success for all at-risk students.

4. In what ways has the district collected feedback from parents or legal guardians on these interventions and services provided this year?

The district collected feedback from parents and legal guardians throughout the school year through parent-teacher conferences, surveys, meetings, phone calls and ongoing communication with school staff. This feedback was review to help and evaluate the effectiveness of Section 31a- funded interventions and services and to identify areas for improvement.

5. Describe the method parents or legal guardians may use to provide feedback on the use of these funds.

Parents or legal guardians may provide feedback on the use of Section 31a funds through parent teacher conferences, surveys, school meetings, phone calls, emails, and direct communication with building administrators or district staff. The district reviews this feedback to help guide future planning and funding decisions.
